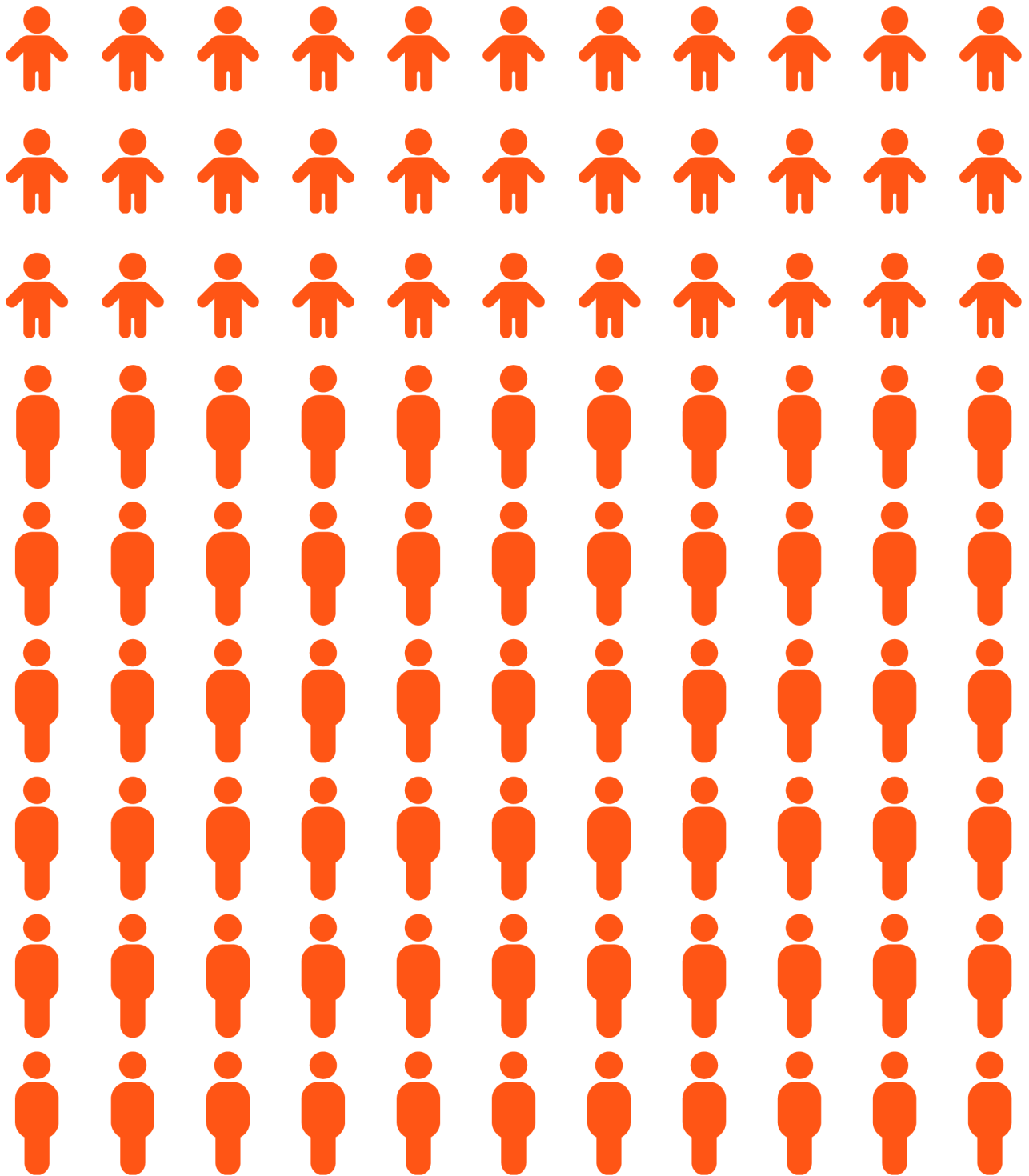
You ran, walked, hiked, and rallied your loved ones so children no longer have to walk long distances each day just to collect water. Together, you turned your steps into something far greater, **clean, safe water for children and families who need it most.**

Because of you, sustainable water systems are now reaching communities across Asia and Africa, bringing life giving water closer to homes, schools, and clinics. With water nearby, children spend less time fetching water and more time learning, playing, and growing. Families are better able to maintain hygiene and health, and communities are strengthened with a reliable source of water for daily life.

Through Global 6K for Water 2025, more than 8,000 children will gain access to clean water. As of 22 March 2026, World Water Day, 2,437 children have already been reached with clean water across communities in Cambodia, Nepal, and the Philippines, with more lives to be impacted as our work continues.

Challenges

Half of the community did not have access to safe, reliable, and sufficient water sources for drinking, handwashing, and sanitation. Children grew up in an environment where preventable waterborne illnesses were widespread. For many, staying healthy was an ongoing struggle.



Impact

2 boreholes have been constructed which now provide children with access to safe and reliable water at homes and schools.

The availability of clean water also equips families and children to maintain hygiene and sanitation practices. During the dry season, the boreholes will also help prevent water shortages for daily needs and agriculture.



A SCHOOL TRANSFORMED

Teachers and students once had to walk long distances to fetch water for the school's daily needs. With water often in short supply, maintaining proper sanitation in the school toilets was a constant challenge. Today, the borehole system provides reliable water for drinking, hygiene, and daily school use, helping create a safe and nurturing environment for children to learn.

"I feel happy that there is clean water available at my school. It is convenient for me to go to the bathroom and wash my hands at school. I especially enjoy taking a shower at school every day, when school ends." — Dina, 10 years old

SINDHULI EAST, NEPAL

Challenges

For many families, access to drinking water meant a long and difficult journey. Children often helped collect water, and girls in particular carried the responsibility for the household. Time that should have been spent studying, resting or playing was instead spent carrying water home.



Impact

33 child friendly drinking water taps have been installed in schools and community spaces, bringing clean water closer to where children learn and live. With safe water now within reach, families are better able to maintain hygiene, and children no longer need to spend hours each day collecting water.



TIME RETURNED BACK TO GIRLS

*"As a girl, we were expected to support the family with most of the household chores. Fetching water is one of the household chores that I had to do to support my mother. However, this was particularly difficult as I had to walk more than half an hour every time to collect water. During monsoon time, it was even more challenging to walk on the slippery road. **Now, we have drinking water tap at our own home, making it so easy to get water now. I no longer have to wake up early to fetch water now.** Thank you World Vision for the support." — Bhesh Kumari, 12 years old*

BOHOL, PHILIPPINES



453 CHILDREN AND 1,347 ADULTS HAVE BEEN REACHED WITH ACCESS TO CLEAN WATER, HYGIENE, AND SANITATION FACILITIES.

Challenges

Schools in the community often did not have reliable access to water. Students had to fetch water from distant wells for hygiene and sanitation in school. The water was often contaminated, putting their health at risk and interrupting valuable learning time.

Impact

2 schools have been equipped with new water systems, including 3,000 litre elevated water tanks, submersible pumps, and piping that supply water for handwashing, sanitation, and school cleaning. Students now have access to clean water within 50 meters of their classrooms.



CLEAN WATER THAT KEEPS CHILDREN IN CLASSROOMS

"Before, I missed classes fetching water from far wells. Now we have water here, I can now focus on studies without walking!" — Clarence, 11 years old

"When I was young, water was a constant challenge in our village. Although some households had deep wells, the schools faced persistent water needs that limited hygiene and sanitation. Today, we are grateful for this partnership with World Vision. We commit to taking good care of this blessing so that it continues to serve future generations." — Ricardo Nogalada, Village Chief

521 CHILDREN AND 821 ADULTS HAVE BEEN REACHED WITH ACCESS TO CLEAN WATER, HYGIENE, AND SANITATION FACILITIES.

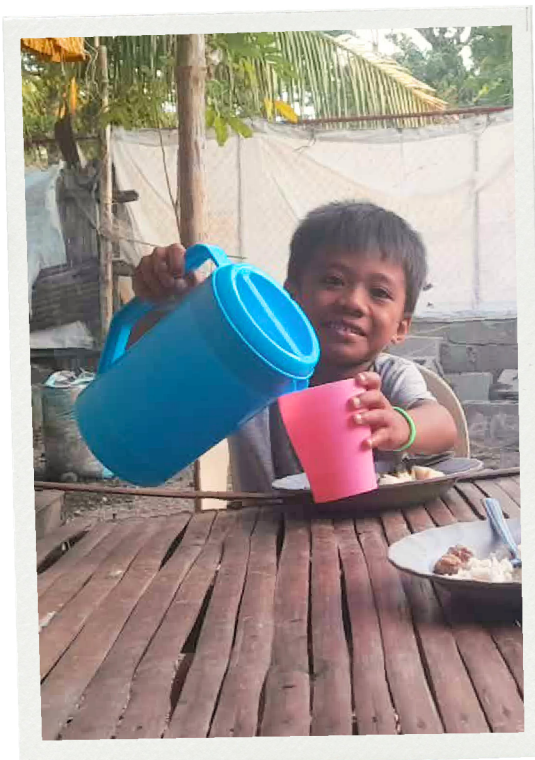
Challenges

The community's water pipeline had deteriorated and could no longer provide reliable water to homes. Families had to fetch water from distant sources for cooking, washing, and daily needs, compromising hygiene and affecting children's school attendance.



Impact

A 690 metre water pipeline has been constructed to extend the community water system. **11 communal taps have also been installed** in accessible locations, bringing water closer to homes and schools.



WATER BRINGS LIFE BACK TO A COMMUNITY

"Now, I can drink clean water when I feel thirsty. I am very happy." — Kurt, 6 years old

"We used to get water from the deep well to prepare our food, wash our dishes, and do our laundry. When we use water from the deep well, my children's school uniform would turn yellow, and it was exhausting trying to get it clean and white again. Now, with water in our faucet, life has become so much easier." — Klea, 32 year old, Mother

"Throughout my years in this community, I have seen first-hand the struggle of my community people in accessing safe and sufficient water. From children to the elderly, many wake up before dawn just to fetch water, a hardship that broke my heart... To the staff, community volunteers, generous sponsors and donors, thank you for your kindness and dedication. On behalf of our community, may God bless you abundantly." — Alfin, 41 year old, Village Chief
