#I / Situational Update

Overview of disaster/crisis

China is in a race to prevent the spread of the coronavirus (COVID-19) which has infected tens of thousands of people. As of 16 February 2020, there were 51,174 confirmed cases and 1,666 deaths throughout the country.

The pandemic is spreading at a rapid pace and World Vision is especially concerned about coronavirus – which can cause severe respiratory symptoms and death – spreading to children living in poorer communities that lack hospitals, medical staff, have weak health systems and the means to effectively monitor transmission and treat those who fall ill.

Highlights of World Vision's disaster response

50,000 masks distributed in five counties in four provinces where World Vision China's Area Programmes are operated, namely Luanping, Baihe, Duchang, Shicheng and Honghe.

On February 11, World Vision China donated 2,436 masks to the Honghe County Public Security Bureau for prevention and control of COVID-19.

Moving forward

World Vision aims to help 390,000 people with a range of emergency health interventions in Hubei Province (the epicentre), Hunan Province and 8 other provinces where World Vision has programmes. This includes:

- Distributing Family Personal Protection Equipment Packs and disseminating health messages to communities in 8 Provinces;
- Distributing emergency supplies of PPE to local health workers in 7 Provinces and in Hubei and Hunan provinces;
- Distributing PPE and disseminating health messages to children's centres and social welfare homes;
- Launching water, sanitation, and hygiene (WASH) education and behavioural change communications activities and materials in 26 area programmes where World Vision works.
