



Nhiệm, busy with her children and bamboo planting in Vietnam, sought ways to invest more. Her husband disagreed, believing she should prioritise taking care of their children. Yet, their income couldn't sustain both the family and the farm's expansion.

Then, World Vision's Microfinance Programme arrived, convincing her husband to let her take loans for business ventures. Starting with 7 piglets from her first loan, Nhiệm's dedication paid off – she now has almost 20 pigs!

She also grew vegetables to diversify meals and provide for the pigs. With the profits, she opened a small grocery store, becoming the family's main breadwinner.

Faith-based Training

"When you get to know that someone believes in you, you are motivated. Belief is an ingredient they lack. They believe they are destined to be poor. Some of this has come as a result of what they have been told by their forefathers and community leaders."

Alice Yugi is a World Vision trainer in Biblical Empowered Worldview, a Faith & Development training programme that World Vision runs to help communities address child well-being concerns by applying biblical teaching. She has trained over 30 community members in Katito in Kenya to push back against decades of negative, self-defeating beliefs and has helped them to realise they have all the tools they need to build fruitful and resilient livelihoods that enable them to care for their children.

"From three chicks, I now have 2,200 chickens. Alice believed in me, and I believed in others," says Damaris who was one of Alice's trainees. To date, more than 500 farms have been established in the community because of this ripple effect of belief from Damaris to many others. This has inspired each of them to see the world as a place where they are valued by God and equipped through His provision to work fruitfully. Thus, the cycle of chronic poverty and hopelessness can be broken.

Break down barriers for children in out-of-home care with special learning needs in Singapore



Why do these children struggle in school?

Some children in out-of-home care have special learning needs, such as dyslexia and attention deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD). Many of them are also burdened with the scars of past trauma from a history of domestic abuse or other difficult family circumstances, which further impair their abilityto learn in school.




Who are children in out-of-home care?

They are children who are temporarily placed in a safe out-of-home care environment, such as a children's home, when their safety and well-being are threatened in their natural families.
