

BEIRUT EXPLOSION LEBANON

#2 / Progress Report (Three Months On)

OVERVIEW OF DISASTER

On Aug. 4, 2020 a massive explosion in Lebanon's capital tore through several downtown neighbourhoods, destroying homes, shattering glass, and releasing thick smoke into the air. The blast has killed more than 180 people, wounding thousands, and leaving as many as 300,000 homeless. The explosion has also caused extensive damage to buildings within a large radius of the blast site and hospitals are said to be overwhelmed.

Lebanon's Prime Minister Hasan Diab has called the incident a "catastrophe" and this disaster could not come at a worse time; Lebanon, which was already hosting millions of Syrian refugees, is in the middle of an economic crisis and has also seen the rate of COVID-19 infections drastically increase over the past few weeks.



WORLD VISION'S RELIEF RESPONSE

Despite COVID-19 restrictions, ongoing protests, the resignation of the Lebanese government on 10 August 2020, World Vision has reached about 12,035 people with the support of international donors and supporters. Specifically, World Vision was able to provide the following support:

- **12,031 individuals received food assistance**, including the distribution of food parcels with each parcel containing one-month ration for a family of 5
- **1,684 hygiene kits distributed**
- **1,451 disinfectant kits distributed**
- **160 blankets, 19 taupaulins, and 499 mattresses distributed**
- **3,653 masks distributed**, accompanied by COVID-19 awareness sessions
- **1,611 psychosocial support kits distributed and 1,000 children provided with psychosocial support sessions.**
