

## MYANMAR FLOODS

### #1 / Response Report

#### Overview of disaster/crisis

Heavy rains in July 2018 resulted in severe flooding in parts of Myanmar, including Hpa-An in Kayin state. A total of 152,000 people across Myanmar were affected, with 11 deaths and 288 evacuation sites set up for survivors.

Whole villages were flooded over, roads were cut off, electricity and supplies were also disrupted. There was extensive damage to livelihoods as farmlands were inundated; seeds and livestock were destroyed. Strong currents also disrupted the planting season, placing families everywhere at risk of food insecurity.

#### World Vision Humanitarian Response

World Vision focused on responding to the urgent immediate needs of flood-affected families in Hpa-An.

A total of 7,500 beneficiaries were reached with rice rations, drinking water and essential kitchen kits. This was essential as families needed food and water to tide them over for 10 days while floodwaters recede.

Some highlights of World Vision's emergency distribution:

- 20 kilograms of rice was distributed to each household, totalling 30,000 kilograms of rice to 1500 hungry families
- 48 litres of drinking water was provided to each household, totalling 72,000 litres of drinking water to 1500 families who had no access to clean water
- A kitchen kit was provided to each household, totalling 1500 kits
