World Vision has been involved in Bo Kluea since 2008. It ended the first phase in 2012. The programme is targeted to end in 2021 and aims to bring about sustainable development that can be fully undertaken by the local communities by working in tandem with national agencies and officials.

GEOGRAPHICAL LOCATION

Bo Kluea district is in Nan province in the northern part of Thailand. It is one of the border districts next to Laos and is in a valley located far from the urban area.

Children, families and communities in the Bo Kluea district are developed and transformed in order to have a good quality of life.

REALITIES

Economic Poverty

The Bo Kluea district has the largest number of poor people in Thailand. In the assessment phase, it was found that 90% of villagers are living below the poverty line. Living conditions are difficult because of inaccessibility, poor infrastructure, low incomes from farming and lack of alternative sources of livelihood. Poor families cannot afford to invest in farming tools, seeds and other necessities. On top of that, the hilly terrain makes farming difficult as there is a lack of dependable water supply and proper infrastructure. As such, people are also unable to produce enough food to feed their families. Only 70% of registered children in the community have access to adequate and nutritious food.

Lack of Access to Water

The hilly terrain encompasses 40% of the community. This remote area belongs to the National Parks Department and the Forestry Department, and families do not own the land they farm on. They are unable to develop the area in ways that will improve their agricultural practices, for instance by building a reservoir. Farmers have to depend on rain water to irrigate crops, which results in crop failure during the dry season. Families also have insufficient water for annual consumption and lack equipment to purify water.

Educational Challenges

Children under five are often deprived of early childhood education as parents search for work in other districts and bring their young children along after the harvest or in the dry season to supplement family income. Access to quality education for children is limited, and going to school is treacherous due to rainfall, resulting in mudslides and uneven surfaces along the roads. There is also a lack of life-skills and occupational training for youth.



KEY CHALLENGES AND WORLD VISION'S KEY INITIATIVES



World Vision helps families earn more income and improve nutrition of their children by providing chickens and hens.

CHALLENGE Families have insufficient income and not enough nutritious food INITIATIVE Enable families to earn enough income

to feed their children and cover family expenses
To assist families in improving their farming productivity,
World Vision provides training on new agricultural
methods to boost their knowledge about rice farming.
A demonstration centre for learning has also been
constructed to promote supplementary occupations.
The centre provides training on fish farming, chicken
rearing and vegetable growing, among other activities.
Aside from such training, World Vision provides
animals and necessary equipment needed to start
these supplementary economic activities. Families with
malnutrition problems are also given chickens, pigs and
vegetables.

CHALLENGE Limited access to clean water sources INITIATIVE Improve the health of children and community members

Communities and schools are provided with water tanks, wells and water filters to secure clean and adequate water for consumption. Latrines are also constructed and training on sanitation management is conducted to improve the communities' knowledge on household sanitation management.

CHALLENGE Children lack opportunities to further their schooling due to transportation difficulties

INITIATIVE Provide transportation support and promote education and life skills

World Vision provides transport fare for children to go to school. This covers the long and dangerous distances that children have to walk and has improved attendance and attention in class. In addition, World Vision supports educational bursaries. Dormitories are also constructed and equipped to ensure equal access to education. Schools are also supported to provide life skills training in dessert making, sewing and chicken rearing. Learning equipment is also provided to childcare centres and schools. Learning camps such as Thai language development camps and numeracy skill development camps are held to improve the reading, writing and numeracy skills of children.

Through all these interventions, World Vision is transforming the lives of children in Bo Kluea, making a change today as well as giving them hope for the future!
