Building the Foundation

During the first 3 years of development, World Vision works closely with local leaders to identify challenges the community faces. The team then maps out an action plan with resources needed to create a healthy, sustainable environment.



Evaluate & Grow

More members of the community become involved in leading and owning the projects during the middle phase of the programme (years 4 to 10). This period is also a time

to make any necessary adjustments to projects, so goals are met.






Enhance Sustainability

Child Sponsorship tackles the root causes of poverty through community empowerment, creating a sustainable and child-focused environment for the child. For that reason, donations are pooled together and do not go directly to your sponsored child(ren).

Your Sponsorship Journey





Receive a welcome kit with essential information about your sponsored child.



Receive Annual Progress Reports (APRs), Christmas greeting cards and updates on the impact of your sponsorship.



Navigate your personalised My World Vision account to write e-letters, and track the progress being made for your sponsored child and community.



Form a memorable bond with them throughout the sponsorship journey.

Things to Note for Mailing Letters/Gifts:

- Include the child's name and ID number on the back of the envelope and top of the letter.
- Indicate your name and partner number at the end of the letter
- Mail your letters/gifts to the World Vision offices directly to the child's country.*

Receive

Expect to receive a reply from your sponsored child within 3 - 4 months.



Send Me a fift

World Vision encourages sponsors to send small and inexpensive gifts to their sponsored child(ren) as a form of encouragement and show of love.

Mailed Gifts

Mailed gifts, should be lightweight and fit easily into an A4-sized envelope (A5-sized envelope for Jerusalem-West Bank-Gaza). Gifts are to be mailed to the World Vision office in your child's country.

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Photographs/ Paintings/Postcards

Recommended gifts



Small toys



Stationery



Socks/Scarves



Mini stuffed-dolls



Important pointers when sending gifts:

- Items have to be small and inexpensive.
- Items should not include money, electronics, food or expensive gifts.
- Items have to adhere to the country's regulations and should not incur additional admin costs or tax.
- Religious items or materials should be avoided.
- Gifts should be brand new.

Gift Notification

A gift notification (GN)* allows you to purchase a local gift for your sponsored child. GNs allow for bigger and bulkier gifts, like bicycles, without the hassle and cost of shipping. The family and child will be consulted by World Vision staff to determine the appropriate gift(s).

Gift Notifications start from **USD\$100**. World Vision staff will purchase the gift for your sponsored child.

Important Pointers for Trips

- Sponsors can only visit their sponsored children through group trips organised by World Vision.
- •The in-country trip costs covers meals, accommodation and in-country transport but excludes air-fare.
- •Trippers are required to book their own flights. Recommended flight routes will be provided to confirmed trippers.

Keep Me Safe

World Vision is committed to safeguarding the privacy of both children and sponsors. To ensure a safe and fulfilling experience for all, we ask for your support and cooperation in safeguarding sensitive information.



PLEASE DO NOT:

- Share sensitive information (child's last name, ID number, medical condition, address, etc.).
- Befriend your sponsored child on social media.
- Begin or encourage correspondence beyond World Vision's supervision.

- Respond to correspondence from the child or family that leaves you uncomfortable.
 - Visit your sponsored child or arrange for them to visit you without authorisation from World Vision during the span of sponsorship.



FAQs

Child Sponsorship

1. How do I know the child is real?

As a sponsor, you can communicate with the child as well as visit them on trips. You will also receive an Annual Progress Report and letters from the child that speaks of their needs, well-being and the impact of your sponsorship.

2. How are the children chosen?

The community identifies children that have the greatest need. World Vision staff will then verify those chosen to ensure a suitable fit for the sponsorship programme.

3. What is the average duration of a sponsorship?

Child sponsorship is a long-term commitment that coincides with the duration of each World Vision Area Programme.

4. When will my sponsorship end?

Sponsorship ends when:

- a. Your sponsored child's community becomes self-sustainable, not requiring further assistance from World Vision.*
- b. The family leaves to an area beyond World Vision's reach.*
- c. You decide to end the sponsorship. Just call us and let us know.

5. What happens to the child if I cancel my sponsorship?

We encourage sponsors to continue their sponsorship. However, should you decide to discontinue, you can encourage a family or friend to take on your sponsorship. Alternatively, World Vision will source for another sponsor to continue the sponsorship.

6. What if the child does not understand English?

You are encouraged to write in English despite communication barriers. World Vision staff will translate the letters to the local language and deliver both original and translated copies to your sponsored child.

7. What are the restrictions that I should keep in mind? (e.g.: information sharing)

As a sponsor, please do not share your own contact information. You are also forbidden from sending your sponsored child money separately as well as expensive or large gifts.

8. Can I stay in contact with my sponsored child via social media or email after the sponsorship ends?

Besides communication barriers and the absence of translation, World Vision does not encourage post-sponsorship contact due to safeguarding concerns for your sponsored child and you. There is also a risk that communications unsupervised by World Vision may be compromised by other parties, disguising as your sponsored child to ask for inappropriate gifts.

9. How else can I contribute?

There are various ways you can contribute to improving the lives of vulnerable children such as helping the community through the gift catalogue, contributing to a project, responding to a disaster appeal, or starting a crowdfunding campaign with family and friends.

Last but not least, be our advocate and help us spread the word by inviting others to be child sponsors and participate in our events or trips.

Money Matters

10. How are the funds utilised?

The Annual reports sent to sponsors will also include information on the usage of funds. World Vision undergoes internal and external audits for financial accountability which can also be found at www.worldvision.org.sg/financial-accountability.

11. Is my donation tax deductible?

No, all donations to World Vision Singapore are non-tax-deductible. As stipulated in the policy by the Singapore Government, only gifts or donations to charities with Institution of Public Character (IPC) status are entitled to tax deductions. IPCs are required to conduct activities that exclusively benefit the local community. As most of our funds are channeled to projects overseas, we do not have the IPC status.

12. How much of my sponsorship goes to the child?

Your sponsored child/family does not directly receive your donation. From our decades of experience on the ground, we know that your contribution creates more impact on your sponsored child when used to benefit the community as a whole.

According to Singapore's charity regulations, the total expenses incurred due to public fundraising appeals in a financial year must not exceed 30% of total donations collected through the public appeals in that year. World Vision's stewardship mandate is for the expenses to be below 20%.
