

Child labour deprives children of their childhood, potential and dignity. Dangerous work and unreasonable hours can take a toll on their young bodies. Without education, there is little chance they will ever take the steps towards their dreams. Your gift will ensure the only weight they carry on their shoulders are their school bags.

We're thankful to our donors and their big hearts, who have made it possible for us to touch the lives of many vulnerable children last year! Here are some highlights on your giving...

Children in the Villages

- 5,695 children in Bangladesh and the Philippines received learning materials and activity packs
- 1 fully equipped Primary Healthcare Clinic constructed in Nepal and expected to benefit 150 young children and 100 pregnant and lactating women
- Female toilets with handwashing facilities constructed in 3 rural schools in Nepal for 291 girls, with 4,148 sanitary pads provided through vending machines installed in the girls' toilets
- 18 handwashing stations provided to 9 primary schools in Cambodia, which impacted 1,719 children
- · A water connection system is being constructed in a community in Cambodia to provide 2,730 villagers with access to water

Vision of a Village - Taikkyi, Myanmar

- 8 vulnerable families received piglets
- · 3,654 women trained in basic financial literacy
- 1,063 families provided with microloans, enabling them to earn an income to keep their children in school
- 1 preschool constructed, enabling 50 children to attend school
- · 11,166 villagers benefitted from holistic interventions

Children in the Cities

- · 250 child labourers in Bangladesh completed health check-ups, participated in health awareness sessions and received hygiene kits
- 80 children and youths in Bangladesh previously involved in child labour are either back in schools
- 1 mobile community library in the Philippines is in process of being procured to run in the slums
- 40 parents/caregivers of child labourers in Bangladesh equipped with business skills and income generation support
- 151 urban poor youths in India completed vocational training and guided to pursue further education or career opportunities

Children in Crisis

- 8 health facilities, 5 mobile clinics and 1 community centre in Syria supported with personal protection equipment (PPE), cleaning sanitisers, medical equipment, medication and other consumable items
- 12,237 adults and children from 2,825 households in Syria reached through regular visits by community health workers
- 32,352 woman and 42,898 children in Syria received primary health consultations for reproductive health and maternity and child care, with 4,435 live births attended to by skilled health professionals
- 45,300 adults and children in Syria benefited from the repair of 3 water stations, while 8,290 displaced adults and children from 10 IDP camps received emergency water through water trucking
- 300 adolescent girls in Afghanistan enrolled in 10 accelerated learning centres and 100 girls started their vocational training in tailoring

Children of Climate Change

- 25,545 people in Ethiopia and Mongolia have a more positive future through the reduction of at least 5,400 tonnes of carbon dioxide
- 412 farmers in Zambia trained to mitigate against the risks of droughts and save their animals with improved fodder
- 45 households in Ethiopia received improved beehives, apicultural equipment and training on improved honey production, thus
 reducing the propensity to cut down nearby forests and increasing vegetation cover
- Solar panels installed in 3 nutrition centres in Bangladesh's refugee camps; electricity generated was used to broadcast COVID-19 and child nutrition messages to mothers waiting to enter the centres with their children
- 1 solar water kiosk constructed in drought-stricken Mongolia, eliminating the use of coal or electricity for the water pump, saving 13kWh of electricity per day

The Survival Fund

- 182,135 people around the world supported before, during, and after disasters
- 104,470 people in Angola, Lebanon, the Philippines, and Zambia provided emergency aid during a disaster
- 1,482 children in Bangladesh and Indonesia received hygiene kits to keep clean and safe from COVID-19
- 1 flood-damaged school in Laos rebuilt
- 3,109 goats provided to farmers in Nepal and Zambia to help them restart their livelihoods




